Spellings

Spelling lists for the whole year are available on our website:

Go to the 'Our Curriculum' tab and select the 'Curriculum Map' option. The spelling lists are on the write hand side. Spelling lists will be taught in class during the week and tested during a timetabled weekly slot (class dependant). Please help your child to learn their spellings each week. Spelling lists are split into two categories. Firstly, statutory words are written in red and the children should be able to spell all of these words by the end of the year. secondly there are lists of words with common letter patterns or rules. Children need to learn these to improve the standard of their spelling within their written work.

The children have had a baseline spelling test this week and will now need to learn list 1. This will be tested week beginning 09.09.19.

Free School Meals

Please note that all Year Three children who previously received Free School Meals are not automatically eligible on transfer to the Junior School. If you would like to apply for Free School Meals an application needs to be made for each child through the Wolverhampton City Council website.
